I maintain awareness through collaboration with our Employer Relations team to provide up-to-date information to students related to industry/market trends, organizations and/or employers actively recruiting, and to engage students in employer/alumni programming, such as career fairs and employer campus visits.

How do you plan on using what you learned in your day-to-day responsibilities and current role? Attending the conference played a pivotal role in achieving one of my key goals since taking on my new job. When I initially joined, establishing a Peer Career Coaching program was a priority, as I strongly believed implementing a peer-to-peer coaching program will contribute to meaningful engagement, enhance the university culture supporting student success, provide skill development, and increase business student internship and full-time role rates due to the collaborative modeling approach. However, as a newcomer I faced the challenge of not knowing where to start as I never created something of this magnitude before. The conference proved to be a game-changer as I connected with seasoned career services professionals overseeing successful peer programs at their universities. Engaging in insightful discussions and learning from their experiences, I gained valuable knowledge on best practices for program initiation, crafting effective job descriptions to attract student candidates, training and onboarding, and identifying meaningful projects and tasks for peer career coaches. The shared insights on program maintenance were particularly instrumental. As a result, I was able to put together a proposal to my Assistant Dean for Academic Programs and Student Success, which was accepted and expanded into my current role. My Peer Career Coach program was implemented the following academic year and has been successfully running for over a year now. I was able to directly apply the conference learnings to enhance the support and guidance offered to our collegiate students.

How will this opportunity benefit the students you work with? My attendance this conference directly translated into substantial benefits for the collegiate students I work with. By participating in this event, I gained access to the latest industry insights, trends, and best practices in career development that I may not have otherwise had. This knowledge was applied to enhance my guidance, coaching, and counseling services, ensuring that I was equipped with up-to-date information to help students navigate the ever-evolving job market. Exposure to exhibitor booths and insights from keynote speakers further enriched my understanding of emerging career opportunities and strategies, allowing me to share relevant and informed advice with my students.
